God's Gentleness

Pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance, and gentleness (1 Timothy 6:11)

We can learn a lot about dealing with our loved ones, friends, and coworkers by imitating God's gentle ways with us. Do you remember when Moses asked to see God's glory? God told Moses to stand in the crevice of a rock. When the Lord passed in front of Moses, He described Himself as, "Yahweh-Yahweh is a compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in faithful love and truth" (Exodus 34:6). Take a few moments and recall those times you've experienced the gentleness of God--especially in those times when you didn't deserve His gentleness. Now think of all the ways God could have responded in those situations. Gentleness is one of God's attributes, and it's also listed as a fruit of the Spirit. Pray for a considerate attitude towards others. Think about ways you could show gentleness to others in particular situations--when a coworker embarrasses you at work, or when someone is struggling and makes a mistake that affects you. Ask the Lord to reproduce His gentleness in you. Pray this "gentle" prayer: Lord Jesus, thank You for treating me with gentleness when I don't deserve it. Please help me show Your gentleness in those times when I am tempted to respond harshly. Amen.
